<p>Food & Dining Services</p>	<p>This year we have added:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Hot Sub Area in the Boar’s Head Deli, a Hot Deli Item Daily • Culinary Table with the Chef, (premium lunch and premium dinner fare cooked to the students specifications), • A full service Create (chop’d) station where salads are made to order with assorted toppings, hand-made dressings, and fresh grilled proteins • Expanded line of Home style entrees, Asian entrees, and soups packaged (ready-to-go) for late night complete meals on the run or for weekend - take home to your Residence Hall all packaged microwave safe. • We have expanded the Outtakes line-up to include a larger variety for quick cuisine on the go with low to mid - range pricing. • Sono the ever-popular Latin Station has been re-vamped in that all burritos, tacos, quesadillas are made to order at the station. • All stations now have \$5 and \$8 complete value (whole) meals. • Roll- back pricing will be in effect from 8pm – 10pm on the hot line which reduces the price \$.05/oz. to increased night-time dinner traffic. • We have also included a full range of retail items that compliment all budgets. <p>Next year the dining hall will have extended hours until midnight, Monday-Friday. We will continue to work with athletics coaches on accommodating breakfast before practice, meals on game days, and incorporating appropriate dietary needs for athletes.</p>
<p>Freshman Aid</p>	<p>No special financial consideration, based on construction disruption, will be given to incoming Westchester freshmen. Every year, the amount of financial aid awarded to freshmen is based on a variety of factors, including marketing and enrollment trends.</p>
<p>New Residence Halls</p>	<p>In fall 2015, nearly 25% of rooms in Alumni Hall will be occupied by upper classmen. Alumni Hall is designed primarily with freshmen in mind—having created a living/learning environment for first year students to become acclimated to University</p>

	life. A new residence hall, designed primarily for returning students, will open in Fall of 2016. Alumni Hall will have over 40 video cameras in the common areas.
Athletic Fields	Finnerty Field (serves baseball and women's field hockey) and the Multi-Purpose field were scheduled to be completed at the beginning of March. The schedule for this work was impacted due to the harsh winter. This work is now scheduled to be completed in July.
Briarcliff Dining Services	It has been confirmed that the dining services in Briarcliff will close next year. Students living in Briarcliff will receive a unique food plan including half of the regular meal plan to be used anywhere on campus and half flex dollars, good for local restaurants and new fresh vending machines (fresh soups, salads, sandwiches, etc.) to be installed in Dow Hall.
Parking	Parking is available on the Westchester Campus in Pleasantville and Briarcliff. All vehicles brought on campus must be registered with the Safety and Security Department at the beginning of each academic year. The Safety and Security Department will issue temporary parking permits with a parking and traffic guide. Special permits are also available for students with unique needs or disabilities. Parking is permitted in designated areas only and prohibited in crosswalks, fire lanes, bus stops, unpaved areas, spaces reserved for the disabled, and any other areas designated as "restricted parking."
